Evacuation planning involves many tasks, like the determination of the evacuation area, safe zones, and appropriate shelters, as well as the coordination and training of the emergency staff or the planning of the routing and regulation of traffic on the evacuation routes. This research concentrates on the optimization of the routing for the case of an evacuation of urban areas with high density and complex street network structure. Especially, the properties of intersections are investigated and heuristic methods are developed to solve the resulting complex mixed-integer linear optimization programs.
